Have you been SCAMMED?

Did you know that one out of every five people over the age of 65 have <u>already</u> been victimized by a financial fraud (IPT Elder Fraud Survey, 2016). Financial Fraud is one form of Elder Abuse. This can happen with Family and Caregivers, Financial Professionals and Unknown Scammers (Telephone or Internet Scams). This type of Scam or Fraud is a crime. Only 1 in 44 cases is typically reported. The most common reason that most of these crimes are not reported is embarrassment or shame. However, there is NOTHING to be ashamed of and it is important to reach out for help. So, how do you recognize an exploiter?

Here are a few examples of RED FLAGS:

- 1. Family Member or Friend with Power of Attorney making inappropriate financial decisions or improper spending
- 2. An internet or phone request for personal information or someone asking for money/gift cards, even if it seems like a good cause
- 3. Someone asking you to change your beneficiary
- 4. An aggressive caregiver or friend that won't allow you to speak for yourself or isolates you from others
- 5. A phone call or email threatening you will be investigated by the IRS or arrested if you don't give them your personal information
- 6. Email asking you to "Verify Your Account Information"

On average, victims of this type of crime lose approximately \$120,000. The total annual losses are over \$37 Billion each year! Of all elder abuse cases reported, 30 % were for financial exploitation. If you feel like this has happened to you or someone you know, please ask for help!

You can call the Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services (BEAS) at (603) 271-7014 to report the incident. If you don't feel comfortable calling them directly, please call the Pittsfield Senior Center for assistance (603) 435-8482.
